Partner Promotions



Hanson Bridgett appointed <u>Laura Long</u> to the role of chief operating officer on Jan. 1. Long previously served as the firm's CFO and will continue to oversee the firm's financial activities.

The firm named partners <u>Alfonso Estrada</u> and <u>Pat Glenn</u> as co-leaders of the firm's labor and employment section, taking the reins from <u>Jahmal Davis</u>. Estrada joined the firm's Los Angeles office in 2021, and Glenn has been in the firm's San Francisco office for 30 years.
